A Special Session on “*Transport systems and sustainable mobility*” will be organized in IEEE EEEIC and I&CPS Europe 2018 Conference, 12th-15th June Palermo, Italy.

Transport sector is one of the main culprits of environmental degradation in urban and suburban areas, in particular as about air pollution and noise. Furthermore, transport systems produce a significant percentage of greenhouse gases, contributing to the global warming. In this context, sustainable mobility is an important objective of the decision makers, especially in densely populated areas, as highlighted also by the European Commission in the white paper on transport. An important contribution to sustainable mobility can be given by electrical transit systems, as well railways, metro and tramways, for public transport, and by the diffusion of electric vehicles, as well electric cars, bicycles and scooters, for individual transport. In this context, the special session is directed to researchers and practitioners that want to share their research results and/or experiences about sustainable mobility. The topics of interest include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Energy-efficiency in transportation systems
- Modelling and simulation of railway systems
- Electric and innovative vehicles
- Transit systems
- Environmental impacts
- Transport policies for sustainable mobility
- ITS for sustainable mobility
